### International Scientific Committee meetings

ICOMOS Ireland has offered the International Scientific Committees the possibility to hold half-day (morning or afternoon) meetings on Tuesday 26 October, in parallel to the Executive Committee meeting and before the start of the Advisory Committee. These may be business meetings, thematic meetings, presentations of the committee's activities or a mixture, set up in partnership with a related local organisation in Ireland.

Information on the meetings will be posted in due course on the special meeting web site. For further information interested Delegates should contact the President of their respective International Scientific Committee.

## 2. Delegates

### a. Right of attendance

All National and International Scientific Committee Presidents, or their designated representatives, are invited to attend the Advisory Committee meeting, the Scientific Symposium, the Tour and the evening events.

All the International Scientific Committee Presidents, or their designated representatives, are invited to attend the Scientific Council meeting.

All the National Committee Presidents, or their designated representatives, are invited to attend the meetings in Regional groups in the first half of the afternoon on 28 October, and to join the Scientific Council session in the morning and the second part of the afternoon as observers.

As the Regional Groups will be meeting in parallel to the Scientific Council, in cases where an International Scientific Committee President is also a National Committee President, this may mean that you have to appoint an alternative representative for your Committee for one of the meetings.

The Executive Committee meetings are only open to the members of this body. Executive Committee members can attend the Advisory Committee meeting, including the Scientific Council and Regional Groups, the Scientific Symposium, the Tour and the evening events.

## **b. Delegation of Powers**

Please note that according to Art. 7 of the Rules for the Advisory Committee any member of the "Advisory Committee who is unable to attend a session may be represented by someone else:

- The President of a National Committee by a member of the National Committee of his/her country.
- The President of an International Committee by a member of his/her International Committee.

Designation must be made in writing, be signed and dated and sent to the President of the Advisory Committee (via the ICOMOS International Secretariat) at least 15 days before the meeting".

Only duly designated delegates will be allowed to vote (one vote per Committee).

## **c. Committee Observers**

A growing trend in recent years has been that many National and International Committees send more than one representative. This is a welcome change that allows members of ICOMOS who are not Committee Presidents to get directly involved in the work of the organization and be enriched by the Scientific Symposium.

However it also places an increasing burden on our Host Committee. It has therefore been decided that whilst Committee Presidents or their designated representative attend free of charge, additional Committee observers will be asked to contribute €50.00 per person. These contributions will go in equal parts towards supporting the Host Committee's meeting budget and the Victoria Falls Fund. Contributions can be paid through the meeting registration form (see under "Personal details" and Total A).

Exceptions may be made if the official delegate comes from a developing country and needs the presence of a colleague for purposes of translation. Please contact the conference organisers prior to registration.

Following receipt of your registration form, ICOMOS Ireland will send you a confirmation email and, upon request, an official invitation letter which you can use for your visa application (see below) or other purposes.

## 4. Visas

Remember that visas, as well as travel & health insurance arrangements are each delegate's individual responsibility. Delegates are requested to make their own checks on whether they need a visa to enter Ireland and we strongly advise you to submit visa applications as soon as you have completed your registration form. Visa applications may need a considerable amount of time to be processed.

Everyone entering Ireland must have a valid passport. Visas are required for some countries. Only delegates from countries listed below **do not currently** require an entry visa for Ireland. All delegates from other countries are strongly advised to contact the nearest Irish diplomatic or consular mission as soon as possible in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. It should be noted that airline companies will not allow boarding in the absence of a valid visa. The Organising Committee, or its agents, cannot accept any responsibility for visa applications.

Information on visa procedures, including a list of relevant Irish diplomatic/consular missions abroad, is available on the website of the Department of Foreign Affairs of Ireland [www.foreignaffairs.gov.ie/home/index.aspx?id=285](http://www.foreignaffairs.gov.ie/home/index.aspx?id=285).

To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Organising Committee will provide only upon request, invitation letters to be attached to the visa applications. Delegates travelling to Ireland via the United Kingdom should remember that they may also require a visa to enter the UK if they intend to spend any time there.

## 5. Languages & Simultaneous Interpretation

There will be English, French and Spanish simultaneous interpretation during the Scientific Symposium, the Scientific Council meeting, and the Advisory Committee plenary sessions.

There will be no simultaneous interpretation during the International Scientific Committee meetings, the Symposium breakout groups and the meetings in Regional Groups.

## 6. Venue

Ireland has a wonderful mix of breathtaking natural beauty and vibrant urban landscapes. It is a country with a rich diversity of ethnic groups and cultures. English is spoken by the majority of Irish people however, pockets of Irish speaking communities, known as Gaeltachtí are dotted around the country, mainly on the West and North-Western coasts.

Dublin is the capital city of Ireland and is home to a great musical and literary tradition, proudly naming Shaw, Yeats, Joyce, Wilde and Beckett as its native sons. The city boasts numerous world-class attractions including castles, museums, art galleries, pubs and cafes. Mountain walks, stately homes and gardens, sandy beaches and fishing villages are within a short distance, while Dublin's Medieval, Georgian and modern architecture provide a stunning, friendly and cosmopolitan city.

The Executive Committee meeting on Sunday 31 October will be held in Malahide Castle.

Few conference centres in the world can claim a location so steeped in history as that of Dublin Castle Conference Centre. Situated in the very heart of historic Dublin, the castle has been completely restored. Dublin Castle has played host to European Union Presidencies, Heads of State, and leaders of business, industry and government. It is also a major tourist attraction, with unique historic layers revealed throughout the complex from the Medieval Tower to the world treasures of the Chester Beatty Library, the Viking Defence Bank and splendid State Apartments.

## 7. Accommodation & Food

### a. Accommodation

Please note that delegates must book and pay their own accommodation.

ICOMOS Ireland has negotiated prices in the following hotels and self-catering apartments for you. All hotels are within a 5/10 minute walk to Dublin Castle Conference Centre. The self-catering apartments can be reached easily by public transport.

## Self-Catering Accommodation

Located in Ringsend in Dublin 4, these self-catering two-bedroom apartments are finished to a very high standard. Each apartment has two bedrooms, two bathrooms, a fully equipped kitchen with oven, fridge, dishwasher, washing machine, sitting room with television and balcony. These apartments are 25 minutes walking distance from Dublin Castle. The number 3 public bus leaves every 15 minutes from around the corner from the apartments and goes into the city centre close to Dublin Castle.

## Hotel Accommodation

### The Arlington Hotel

The Arlington Hotel Temple Bar is a three star hotel ideally located in the heart of Dublin City Centre opposite Dublin Castle, on the doorstep of Temple Bar and just a short walk from Grafton Street, Trinity College, Stephens Green, O2 Arena, museums, theatres and Parliament buildings. All rooms are en-suite with multi-channel TV, direct dial telephone, tea/coffee making facilities, hair dryer and trouser press. The Arlington Hotel is approximately 2 minutes walking distance to Dublin Castle.

### Temple Bar Hotel

The Temple Bar Hotel is a three star hotel located in the heart of Dublin's cultural quarter including many famous pubs and restaurants. The Rendezvous Bar is both cosy and traditional. Bedrooms provide all the facilities required by the modern day traveller. The hotel is approximately 5 minutes walking distance to Dublin Castle.

## **Jurys Inn Christchurch**

Located in the heart of Dublin City opposite Christchurch Cathedral. This three star hotel is modern with attractive rooms capable of accommodating up to 3 adults or 2 adults and 2 children. All rooms are en-suite with multi channel TV, tea/coffee making facilities, radio and direct dial phone. The Inn has an informal restaurant and lively pub. The hotel is 2 minutes walking distance to Dublin Castle.

## **Paramount Hotel**

This three star hotel is one of Dublin's most cosmopolitan, tastefully designed to the very elegant 1930's style of architecture. Situated on the edge of the famous Temple Bar Area, the hotel is approximately 2 minutes walking distance from Dublin Castle.

## **The Radisson Royal**

The hotel is a newly built four star superior hotel, both elegant and contemporary in style. Located at the crossroads of Golden Lane and Chancery Lane, it is within walking distance of top city landmarks such as Trinity College, Dublin Castle and the famous Grafton Street. There are also 60 underground car parking spaces which are available to all hotel guests. The hotel is approximately 4 minutes walking distance to Dublin Castle.

## **Brooks Hotel**

Brooks Hotel is a four star boutique hotel within few minutes walk of Dublin's famed Grafton Street, Temple Bar and Trinity College. Designed to the highest standard, this contemporary Dublin City hotel enjoys superb facilities. Drury Street municipal car park is located directly opposite. The hotel is approximately 10 minutes walking distance to Dublin Castle.

## **b. Food**

Breakfasts are served at the places of accommodation at the expense of the delegates. Dublin Castle Conference Centre is located in the heart of Dublin city centre so there are a range of shops, cafés, pubs, hotels and restaurants from which delegates can purchase their lunch. Evening meals, other than the formal receptions are at the expense of the delegate. ## **8. Social Events & Tourist Excursions**

### **a. Technical Tours**

On Saturday 31 October, a Technical Tour is being offered to delegates only and is free of charge. More detailed information will be provided to you at a later date and on the meeting web site. Please indicate on the registration form if you will be joining one of the three Technical Tours (Glendalough, Brú Na Bóinne or Castletown and Russborough) and whether you will be accompanied. These tours are free of charge to attend.

## b. Tourist Excursions

Ireland offers a large variety of entertainment, scenery and culture. The social programme we have drawn up offers delegates and accompanying persons the opportunity to sample the atmosphere and hospitality for which Ireland is famous worldwide. The programme will comprise of daily excursions such as a Dublin City tour, a Newgrange tour, a Dublin Bay and Castle tour, and a Wicklow tour. These Optional Daily Tours run from 25 October to 1 November and can be booked and paid for through the registration form.

### Dublin City Tour (Hop On Hop Off)

This fully guided tour gives you an overall flavour of our historic and ancient city. You will see examples of Dublin's superb architecture in the Georgian Streets and Squares. This hop on - hop off tour will allow you to visit St. Patrick's Cathedral and Christchurch Cathedral, the Guinness Storehouse and the Old Jameson Distillery.

Tour duration is approximately 90 minutes.

**Details:** This tour runs daily, with the first tour departing at 09:30.

**Cost:** €15.50 per person.

**Tour departs from:** 14 Upper O'Connell St, Dublin 1.

### Newgrange (Half Day Tour)

This tour is also known as the Valley of the Kings Tour. In the heart of the Boyne Valley, Co. Meath, you will visit the Bru na Boinne Visitor Centre, which interprets the archaeological heritage of the Boyne Valley, including the megalithic passage tombs of Newgrange & Knowth. You will be taken on a guided tour of the tombs; the oldest and largest Neolithic burial chamber in Europe (3000 BC), which predate the Egyptian Pyramids. Lunch is not included, although a restaurant is on site.

**Details:** This tour runs every Monday, Tuesday, Friday and Saturday.

**Times:** Tour departs at 10:00 and returns to Dublin at 17:00 approx.

**Cost:** €34.00 per person.

**Tour departs from:** Gray line desk 1, Dublin Tourism Office, Suffolk St, Dublin 2.

Please be at the meeting point 20 minutes before the tour's departure.

### The Dublin Bay & Castle Tour

After a brief introduction to Dublin City, you will visit the pretty coastal village of Malahide and the 14th century Malahide Castle, where you will enjoy a guided tour and have time to wander in the craft shops and gardens. The tour then trails past the village of Howth towards Howth Summit where there will be a 10 minute stop to enjoy the breathtaking views of Dublin Bay. The tour then continues back into Dublin via the northern coastline.

**Details:** This tour runs daily.

**Times:** Tour departs at 10:15 and 14:00 and lasts approx 3.30 hours.

**Cost:** €25.00 per person.

**Tour departs from:** Outside Dublin Tourism, 14 Upper O'Connell Street, Dublin 1.

Please be at the meeting point 20 minutes before the tour's departure.

### The Wicklow Tour (Full Day Tour)

Sit back, relax and let us take you through some of the loveliest countryside in Ireland. This tour takes you first to the stunning 6th century monastic settlement in Glendalough. Our guide will take you around the site, which boasts a 10th century conical roofed Round Tower as well as a St. Kevin's Kitchen and Cross. The tour trail continues to the pretty village of Avoca (home to the famous drama Ballykissangel), with a stop at the famous Avoca Handweavers. There you can enjoy a stroll around the village dropping into Fitzgerald's pub or visiting the famous Handweavers craft shop. Lunch is not included, although a lunch venue will be available on the day.

**Details:** This tour runs daily.

**Cost:** €28.00 per person.

**Time:** Tour departs at 09:45 and returns to Dublin at 17:15.

## **9. International Transport and Getting Around in Ireland**

### **a. International flights**

There are flights from most destinations in Europe and many daily flights from the UK. Main Airlines operate routes to Ireland including: Aer Lingus, Air Baltic, Air France, Air Malta, Air South West, American Airlines, BMI, British Airways, Bulgaria Air, Central Wings, City Jet, Click Air, Continental Airways, Czech Airlines, Delta Airlines, Estonian Air, Etihad Airways, Fly B Airways, Iberian Airways, Lufthansa, Lux Air, Lot Polish Airlines, Norwegian Air Shuttle, Ryanair, SAS, Sky Europe, Swiss Air, Turkish Airlines.

### **b. Getting to and from the airport**

Please note that the organisers are not able to pick up individual delegates at the airport or take them there on departure. Dublin airport is located 10 kilometres from Dublin city centre.

There are a number of private and public bus services that operate from outside the airport arrivals terminal:

- Aircoach: a privately run bus service, operates between the airport and a number of city hotels, see [www.aircoach.ie](http://www.aircoach.ie)
- Airlink (bus 747): operated by Dublin Bus, will bring you directly from the airport to Busaras, the central bus station, located in the city, see [www.dublinbus.ie](http://www.dublinbus.ie)
- AerDart: a combined bus and train service that will bring you from Dublin airport to any DART station along the route for an all-inclusive price, see [www.dublinbus.ie](http://www.dublinbus.ie)

There are also a number of other public bus services operating between the airport and various destinations.

A Taxi service is available 24 hours a day from Dublin airport to any destination in Dublin. The average price of a taxi from the airport to the city centre is €25.00 - €35.00.

### **c. Getting about in the city**

Dublin city centre is quite small and everywhere is easily accessible by foot.
